



InDesign–Fonts

Type 1 fonts no longer supported

Beginning with InDesign 18.2 (March 2023) Type 1 fonts (also known as PostScript fonts) are no longer supported. When opening a document containing Type 1 fonts, the Missing Fonts dialog box will appear, even if the fonts are activated.




Type 1 fonts will show as missing in InDesign 18.2, even if the fonts are activated.



Version 18.1 vs 18.2

The Find/Replace Font (Type > Find/Replace Font) dialog box shows the fonts used in a document and indicates if any font is missing. In the screenshots below, notice when a document containing a Type 1 font is opened in InDesign 18.1 it shows no missing fonts, but when opening the same document in InDesign 18.2, it shows the Type 1 font as missing.

Type 1 fonts are not supported in these versions and later.

Note: Fonts activated from the Adobe Fonts library may appear in Creative Cloud software with a file type of OpenType Type 1. This should more precisely display as the file type OpenType CFF.


CFF is a compact representation of Type 1 that Adobe will continue to support.



Type 1 vs OpenType




InDesign 18.1–Type 1 (PostScript font)
